**Lake Bluff History Museum's Popular Auto Show Returns June 24**

**Lake Bluff, IL** – A treat is in store for fans of vintage automobiles when collectors of classic automobiles showcase their vehicles on Saturday June 24, 2017 from 3-7 pm as part of Lake Bluff History Museum's fifth annual Auto Show. If history is an indicator, close to 150 pre-1980 vehicles are expected to fill east Scranton Avenue and Center Avenue adjacent to Lake Bluff's Village Green. These streets will be closed during the event to accommodate the amazing cars and the people admiring them. There is no charge to attend this popular, family-friendly event.

The museum's 1931 Lake Bluff Ice Truck and 1923 Ford Model T will be prominently displayed along with dozens of classic cars dating from 40, 50 ... 80 years ago. The beautifully restored Model T, donated to the museum by a local family, will be raffled off during the auto show. The drawing will be held at 6 pm. Proceeds from this generous donation will support the museum and its historic ice truck. Raffle tickets cost \$100 and can be purchased online or in the museum. Only 300 tickets will be sold, so those yearning to travel as was the style in 1923 should visit [lakebluffhistory.org](http://lakebluffhistory.org) now!
