Lake Bluff Fire Department Encourages Residents to "Adopt a Hydrant"

Can firefighters locate the fire hydrant closest to your home in the event a fire emergency during snowy winter weather? Due to the snowy conditions this winter, Lake Bluff's volunteer firefighters have uncovered as many fire hydrants as possible; however, many hydrants still remain covered.

The Lake Bluff Fire Department encourages residents to "adopt a fire hydrant" near their home by keeping the hydrant clear of snow during the winter season. At a minimum, residents living close to a fire hydrant are asked to make sure the hydrant is cleared of snow enough so that it is visible from the street. This will help decrease the time it takes for firefighters to respond to a fire emergency. Please don't let your neighborhood hydrant remain "under cover".
