### Household Waste Collection Reminders

The warmer days of spring create a great opportunity for residents to landscape the yard for the season and to clean the house in preparation for the summer. With warmer temperatures upon us the Village offers the following reminders for residents to keep in mind when disposing of refuse, recycling and yard waste:

- Household refuse and recycling waste must be placed in their appropriate container and not set along side of the cart (larger containers are available by calling Groot at 877-404-7668);
- Do not commingle refuse, recycling and yard waste items;
- When disposing of yard waste, leaves and grass clippings must be bagged in Kraft-type paper bags (available at home improvement stores everywhere) and not exceed 32 gallons nor weigh more than 50 pounds;
- Brush, vines and branches must be bundled or bagged, not exceed 2 feet in diameter and 4 feet in length, and not weigh more than 50 pounds. If bundled, the material shall be securely tied with only twine (plastic, metal or rope ties are prohibited at compost sites);
- Refuse and recycling containers may only be placed at the curb for collection no earlier than 4:00 p.m. on the day prior to pick-up and must be removed after the collection takes place; and
- Special pick-ups in addition to the regular collection service may be scheduled by calling Groot (877-404-7688) or residents may dispose of items that are collected as part of the regular household waste collection program at the Public Works Recycling Facility (640 Rockland) during the week (7am to

### **Antique Auto Show and Block Party Liven Up Lake Bluff June 27**

On Friday, June 27 (from 5:00 to 9:00 pm) local collectors of antique automobiles will showcase their vehicles during the second annual Antique Auto Show and Block Party sponsored by the Lake Bluff History Museum and Lake Bluff Brewing Company. This year's event includes music provided by The Luxmen and promises to be bigger and better than the 2013 block party, at which the Museum "revealed" the restored Lake Bluff Ice Truck. There is no charge for the event. In case of rain, the event will be held June 28.

E. Scranton Avenue will be closed from Sheridan Road to Walnut Avenue to accommodate the cars, band, refreshment tent and participants during the event. Stroll down memory lane as you admire antique cars including a 1930 Model A, 1923 Model T and the 1931 Lake Bluff Ice Truck; enjoy refreshments provided by the Lake Bluff Brewing Company and tap your feet to the tunes of The Luxmen.

Included among the vehicles on exhibit will be the restored 1931 Lake Bluff Ice Truck. The Lake Bluff History Museum and a team of volunteers provided the funding, expertise, time, talent and ingenuity required to bring this truck back to life. Opportunities to contribute to the restoration and ongoing care of this historic treasure will be provided during the block party. As was done last year, individuals can fund restoration of "parts" of the truck, or provide for ongoing maintenance. In addition, the Museum will be selling prints of the Ice Truck by local artist Mark McMahan.

The Lake Bluff History Museum connects people with Lake Bluff's history by researching, organizing, and preserving artifacts relevant to Lake Bluff and its past and present inhabitants; sharing knowledge by telling stories of the people and the social history of Lake Bluff; and creating activities that bring history to life. Located at 127 E. Scranton Avenue, Lake Bluff, the facility is open Tuesday and Thursday from 1:00 to 4:00 pm and Saturday from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm, or by appointment.
