[IL Rt. 176 Roadway Construction Project Update](#)

As part of the [Target Store Development](#) (southwest corner of Rt. 176/41) there are several off site improvements moving forward, including the construction of:

- a dedicated north bound turn lane on west bound Rt. 176 at Waukegan Road;
- an enhanced four way intersection at Rt. 176 and Shagbark:
 - addition of a left turn lane onto Rt. 176 from Shagbark,
 - addition of a left turn lane onto Shagbark from Rt. 176,
 - addition of a right turn lane onto Rt. 176 from Shagbark, and
 - addition of a right turn lane onto Shagbark from Rt. 176;
- a dedicated left turn lane onto Carriage Park Ave. from

Waukegan Rd.;

- dedicated right and left turn lanes onto Waukegan Rd. from Carriage Park Ave.; and
- dedicated right and left turn lanes onto Waukegan Rd. from Albrecht Drive.

June 26, 2015: During the week of June 22nd contractors completed all roadway striping for the development and activated temporary traffic signals. It is anticipated ComEd will install new electrical service for the permanent signals during the week of June 29th, and following installation, inspection by IDOT will take place (weather permitting).

Lake Bluff Contracts with CodeRED to Provide Emergency Notification Services to Community

Following an extensive and thorough evaluation and review of alerting systems, the Village of Lake Bluff (Village) has implemented the CodeRED system, a high-speed emergency notification service provided by Emergency Communications Network, based in Ormond Beach, Florida. Public safety officials across the United States have credited CodeRED notifications for saving lives and many successful events including locating missing children, apprehending wanted criminals and issuing timely evacuations. The CodeRED system will serve as the backbone of the Village's emergency planning and communications outreach. The platform will

allow the Village to communicate with residents and Village personnel by sending telephone calls, text messages, emails, social media and CodeRED Mobile Alert app messages in an effort to effectively inform residents of emergencies to protect life and property. CodeRED, among other notification systems available, was selected for its unrivaled reliability and accuracy, as well as the system's global use.

"CodeRED's robust system will provide Village officials with a reliable, easy-to-use interface to quickly disseminate critical information to our residents during emergencies. We are very eager to use this technology to enhance our emergency preparedness plans," said Police Chief David Belmonte. We anticipate using the system to notify residents in specific geographic locations of weather emergencies, floods, missing children notices or any other situation where we need to notify residents quickly.

Lake Bluff has also contracted the CodeRED Weather Warning system, an automated weather warning technology that delivers phone calls, text messages, and emails to registered residents and businesses within the direct path of severe weather. The CodeRED Weather Warning system is an opt-in service that automatically notifies those registered of tornado, flash flood, and severe thunderstorm warnings just minutes after an alert is issued by the National Weather Service (NWS). The Village of Lake Bluff has been provided an initial database of residential and business telephone numbers, however all residents living within the Lake Bluff Village limits are encouraged to visit <http://www.lakebluff.org/departments-services/police-department/110-codered> and click on the CodeRED logo to enroll additional contact information including cell phone numbers, text and email addresses. No one should assume they have been automatically added to the emergency contact database. The enrollment link will also allow residents to opt-in to receive the automated Weather Warnings. Residents and businesses are encouraged to enter both a cell phone number and email address, and designate the types of weather warnings to be received.

Third Annual Auto Show Returns to Lake Bluff June 27, 2015

On Saturday, June 27th, from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m., local collectors of classic automobiles will showcase their vehicles during the third annual Lake Bluff History Museum Auto Show and Block Party. The blocks of east Scranton Avenue and Center Avenue adjacent to Lake Bluff's Village Green will be closed to accommodate the cars and people admiring the cars; the museum tent where sno-cones will be offered, prints of Mark McMahon's painting of the ice truck will be sold and history celebrated; a display of automobile memorabilia from The Last Detail's Kenilworth Galleria; food offered by Catering by Kenny; music, refreshments from Lake Bluff Brewing Company and more!

The museum's own 1931 Lake Bluff Ice Truck will be prominently displayed along with dozens of classic cars dating from the early 1930s into the 1980s. Step back in time and imagine what it might have been like to drive cars built 40, 50 ... 80 years ago. The 2015 event promises to be bigger and better than ever, thanks to a great group of volunteers working behind the scenes in advance of the event to promote and recruit exhibitors, and at the event to ensure things run smoothly.
