Village News

[Route 41 Open and Final Storm Update](#)

Illinois DOT reopened Route 41 to traffic last night. This marks the end of the last major travel disruption for Lake Bluff residents.

If you are looking to dispose of excess trash due to flooding, your options are:

- **Today:** A special trash collection (no landscape waste) will be performed today by Groot for all routes / residences in Lake Bluff. Residents may place trash at the curb immediately.
- **This Weekend:** The Lake Bluff Public Works Facility (640 Rockland Road) is accepting trash, recycling, and landscape waste may be dropped off by Lake Bluff residents 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. today, as well as 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. - **Next Week:** If you're cleaning over the weekend, Groot will provide regular residential waste service on Monday and Tuesday. For more information on what you can put at the curb, [click here.](#)

Finally, be aware: Flood waters may have contained organisms that can cause disease. As you continue cleaning, mind this important guidance from the Lake County Health Department:

- **Wash your hands and scrub fingernails thoroughly with soap and safe water** after working in flooded areas, especially before eating or drinking.
- **Scrub basement and other areas that have been flooded** with a household detergent solution. Use a solution of one-quarter cup of household bleach in a gallon of water, then flush the washed areas with safe water.
- **Scrub furniture, walls, fixtures and appliances** with soap and safe water.
- **Machine wash affected clothing, bedding, and cloth toys.**
- **Sanitize non-porous children's toys** by first washing them with soap and safe water, then soaking them for at least one minute in a solution of one tablespoon of bleach to a gallon of water. Do not rinse objects after soaking; allow to air dry.
- **Consult a physician about obtaining a tetanus booster if you worked in or walked through floodwaters.** In general, flood workers who have had a tetanus shot within the past 10 years will not need to be revaccinated. However, workers who acquire a wound and who have not had a tetanus shot within 5 to 10 years may need a tetanus booster.

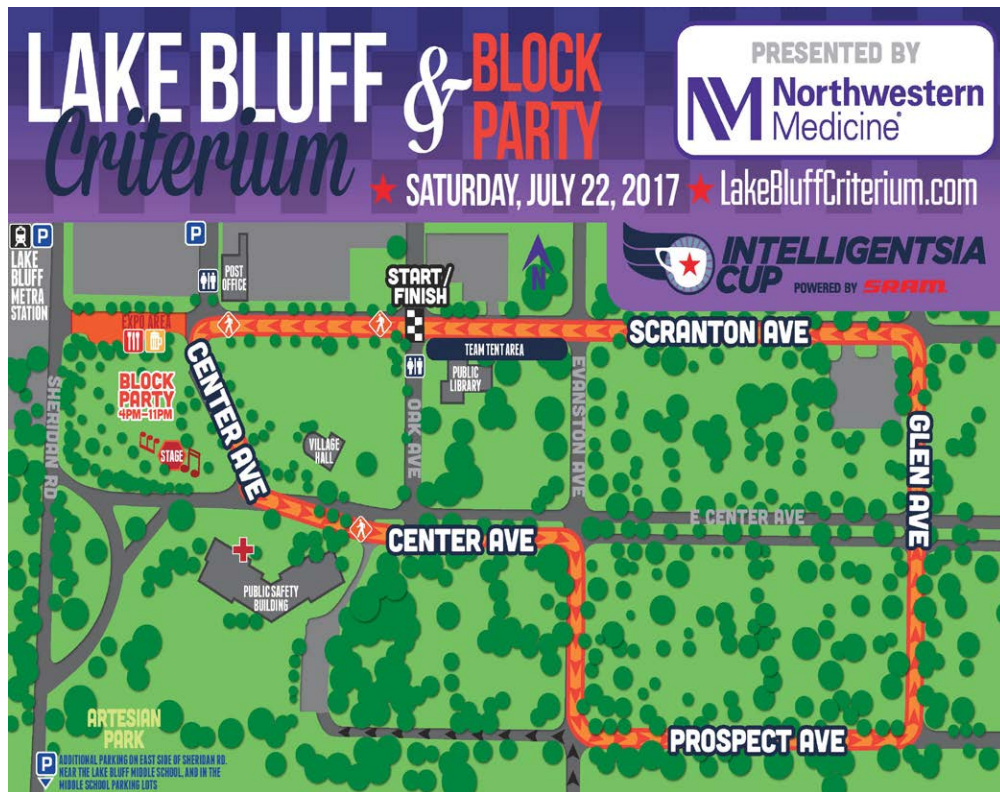

There will be no brakes on for the 6th annual Northwestern Medicine Lake Bluff Criterium and Block Party, July 22nd, in downtown Lake Bluff, with races starting at 8:45 a.m. ending about 8:30 p.m. at 113 E. Scranton Avenue. The Block Party on the Village Green begins at 4 p.m. and continues into the evening. Northwestern Medicine is once again the proud host of the day, providing an exciting opportunity for everyone to enjoy some unique summer fun.

The 13 bike race categories throughout the day with riders in the pro men’s and women’s races from 30 states in the USA, as well as 15 foreign countries that include Germany, New Zealand, France, Australia, Columbia, and Costa Rica, to name a few. Lake Bluff’s very own Grand Tour will be lead off by the all new X5xDrive40e iperformance BMW, a vehicle with electric torque, provided by Knauz Automotive Group Lake Bluff. Visitors will be able to see the X5x along with other vehicles from Knauz Autopark throughout the Village. Knauz has been a major sponsor of the Lake Bluff Criterium since 2011.

This year’s races include special races for kids, ages 3 to 9. Once again sponsored by the Lake Forest Bank & Trust Company, these heats start at 5:25 p.m. A parent or guardian must register each child in advance at the bank’s Lake Bluff branch beginning Monday, July 17th through Friday, July 21st from 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and on Saturday, July 22nd from 8:30 a.m. until noon. There is no entry fee for the kids but they MUST wear a helmet. And, everyone’s a winner! Children who ride will all receive a medal and a “Take 2” coupon for two free ounces that can be added to their ice cream treat at Suzy’s Swirl on Rockland Road, Lake Bluff.

Spectators will have an opportunity to watch the female and male pros compete for prize money totaling over \$7,000, a hand-cycling race for disabled individuals, the Fyxation Open, where the racers ride fixed gear bikes with no brakes, and more. Two Jumbotrons will allow guests to view the races from the Village Green, while they’re having fun at the Block Party, enjoying food and refreshments from local restaurants, and listening to live music, scheduled to start at 8 p.m.

Lake Bluff has options for seniors on the move! These transport services are provided by the Lake Forest-Lake Bluff Senior Citizens Foundation:

- **Senior Car:** Drivers are available weekdays from 8:45 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. for your weekday appointments, errands, or visits. Please call as soon as you know your schedule. Rides are \$3 each way. A handy coupon for 10 rides can be purchased from the drivers or in Dickinson Hall. *Tips are not accepted.*
- **Taxi Vouchers:** Subsidized taxi service is offered for residents age 65 and over who do not drive. Trips must begin and end within the Lake Forest High School district. Riders present coupons worth \$3 of fare, and pay the remainder. Sixteen coupons per 30-day period can be mailed to your home or purchased at Dickinson Hall. *Tips are not accepted.*
- **Senior Bus:** Weekly trips to local shopping centers and grocery stores are scheduled. The bus service is wheelchair accessible.
